## **Coordinator Reports**

Conclave-Jarod Emerson, Wapashuwi:

The lodge will provide tents for the lodges, but requests that you let them know how many you will require. (This will be most likely be included as part of the registration process.) They are working on cots and mattresses, but are not sure if they will be provided yet or not. There will possibly be a camp fee. There are 13 campsites and plenty of room for parking. The campsites have latrines and showers. There are handicap accessible cabins and buildings. There are 3 lakes so bring your fishing gear, there will be boating, along with a range for shotgun, rifle, and archery. There are computers and Internet access for those who need it, and some of the training sites are sheltered with electricity. The dining hall seats 350, there is no menu prepared yet. The menu and associated budget will be presented at the ALTC CoC. The Conclave Adviser is Dorris Fitzgerald.

Marketing-Jon Hebb, Menawngihella:

He will try to send someone to all of the winter banquets. Table tents and flyers will be online eventually. If you have any pictures that you would like on the website or on a promotional video please send them to David Gersting. There is a conclave facebook group in the works, and if you would like Section Officers at lodge events such as ordeals please let Michael Bledsoe know and we will try to send someone if possible.

Trading Post:

We have had some online requests, and we are trying to expand to a committee to take care of that, if you know of one youth and one adult interested please let us know.

Web Team- David Gersting, Onondaga:

David asks that lodges please update information on ArrowLink, and if you have a big list send it to David and he can upload it for you. We ask that lodges send us their LEC rosters. If you have content for the conclave website, send it to the Marketing team. An Admin Toolbox upgrade is on the way. Enhancements to the Conclave website include allowing for multiple registrations during one session and accepting medical forms online.

### **Old Business:**

We did a recap of conclave, presented by Sean McCabe, and Brian Seeton spoke about high adventure camps and recommends all youth to attend OA Ocean Adventure at Sea Base, OA Trail Crew at Philmont, and/or OA Voyage at Northern Tier.
